Workshop on Indian Philosophy: Today and Tomorrow



On January 28, 2022, the Department of Philosophy, Mahatma Gandhi Shati Smarak Mahavidyalaya Garua Maksudpur, Ghazipur organized a One-day workshop on “**Indian Philosophy: Today and Tomorrow.**”

The head of the Department of Hindi and the incumbent Principal Shri Sushil Tiwari made the ceremonial welcome of the guest speaker. Mr. Shravan Kumar, Assistant Professor of Philosophy had been invited as the guest speaker. The resource person started his lecture by throwing light on ancient Indian philosophy. He vocalized that **Indian philosophy**, the systems of thought and reflection that were developed by the civilizations of the Indian subcontinent.

He further added that this includes both orthodox (*astika*) systems, namely, the Nyaya, Vaisheshika, Samkhya, Yoga, Purva-Mimamsa (or Mimamsa), and Vedanta schools of philosophy, and unorthodox (*nastika*) systems, such as Buddhism and Jainism. Indian thought has been concerned with various philosophical problems, significant among which are the nature of the world (cosmology), the nature of reality (metaphysics), logic, the nature of knowledge (epistemology), ethics, and the philosophy of religion. He also claimed that the quest to integrate Western and indigenous philosophical traditions in a truly Indian philosophy remains an ongoing quest.

Mr. Nitesh Pandey also shed light on the contemporary Indian Philosophy.
