The head of the Department of Hindi and the incumbent Principal Shri Sushil Tiwari made the ceremonial welcome of the guest speaker. Mr. Dharendra Kumar Assistant Professor has been the key resource person for this guest lecture. He commenced this lecture by defining human rights as the basic rights and freedoms that are inherent to all human beings, regardless of their nationality, race, gender, religion, or any other status. These rights are recognized and protected by international law, and they include civil, political, economic, social, and cultural rights. The concept of human rights is found on the principle that all human beings are equal in dignity and rights, and that they are entitled to these rights simply because they are a set of values relating to justice and equality is known as human rights. They acknowledge our right to live as we choose and to reach our full potential as people. Human rights are "universal" in nature. Human rights are the fundamental liberties and rights that every person has in the world from the moment of their birth until the moment of their death.

These fundamental rights are founded on common ideals like independence, fairness, respect, decency, and equality. These principles are outlined and secured by legislation. These liberties are essential and unalienable. Human rights have been demonstrated to be necessary for every person to be able to live their lives to the utmost. The most distinctive quality of human rights is that they are challenging to define but unavoidable.
