Title of the Practice

1- ENVIRONMENT-FRIENDLY CAMPUS

Objectives: To create a learning conducing atmosphere that empowers students to emerge as crusaders of sustainable living understanding their responsibility towards ecological diversity and inculcate in them a sense of environmental mindfulness through teaching and social activities.

To promote awareness about environmental issues among the students, staff and society

To achieve better sustainability in the campus and improve the quality of life of all the stakeholders

To encourage and inculcate, the environmentally sustainable practices among students in their social world.

To implement 3 'R' (Reduce/Reuse/Recycle) policy on the campus

To support and implement "Swachh Bharat Abhiyan" for healthy India

To organize seminars/workshops etc. on environment-related issues.

The Context: It is universally acknowledged that environmental sustainability is one of the major concerns today. Besides the pursuit of academic excellence, societal and academic reforms are meant to motivate students so that they are able to develop themselves into educated men and women, ready to carve a niche for themselves in society. Keeping the growing ecological concerns in mind, there is a dire need for immediate action to be carried out and promote eco-friendly practices. The college firmly believes that, when it comes to environmental conservation, awareness must be followed by sustainable practices. The rural village region and green landscaping of college are the necessary features for shaping and



sustaining an eco-friendly campus. College has taken the responsibility to nurture and care for the environment and integrate environment-friendly practices with the teaching-learning process.

The Practice: Environment-Friendly Campus Policy was devised to serve as a guiding light for the staff and students to promote an on-campus lifestyle that preserves and protects the environment. The college has developed beautiful campus with Lawns. Signboards/posters are displayed on the college campus for encouraging ideas of plastic-free campus, noise pollution, and environmental awareness. The college organizes seminars/workshops etc. on environment-related issues. LED bulbs are installed in the college buildings to save electricity. Cautionary notes in the washrooms prompt the students to report leaking taps or faucets. Students are promoted to bring lunchbox from home in health perspective and to reduce plastic rappers of chips, biscuits. Cautionary notes are placed in every classroom and staffroom to switch off unused lights and fans.

College promotes the idea of harmonious living with nature. There are varieties of plants that especially attract butterflies and birds to the campus. Most of the students in the college commute by the bicycle or on foot, College provide free parking facility to the bicycle riders. Cycle races are organised to promote the culture of fuel free transportation. Waste management: All plastic, glass, paper, electronic wastes and recyclable waste on campus is mindfully segregated and disposed of accordingly. Paper-saving practices such as retaining ecopies of teaching plans, salary slips, and examination details have reduced the quantum of paper used on campus. Various departments conduct its internal examinations, assignments, and class test in e-mode through Google form.

Evidence of Success:

Through periodical tree plantations, Flora and Fauna on the campus has enriched, which has turned into eco-friendly campus.

Students have become mindful of the environment, and they enthusiastically participate in activities that help sustain the planet.

There is a reduction in the amount of paper used.



More than 80% students use bicycle to reach the college. Few students switch to electric Scootty.

Faculty members have started to work in e mode to reduce paper waste.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

The college understands this noble responsibility and puts all efforts to cultivate a community of proactive students equipped with the knowledge and skills necessary to effect positive change in society. Its



mission is to nurture girls and boys to become responsible citizens of the nation. Various Programs and activities are introduced and activate by the college for students' learning so that they get involved in community issues, develop compassion for others, and offer hands of support to the needy.
